Could this have been Aramaic or Greek or the many translations used today. I feel Isaiah 28:11 is based on every translation used today. Furthermore God speaks in Psalm 12:6-7. (Psalm 12:6-7) The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever. How are the words of the LORD pure if they are not purified? The Geneva Bible comes seventh in line after a history of Bibles starting if memory serves me right the Wycliff which I happen to have saved on my hard drive in PDF format. The seventh in line is the Geneva Bible which all followed each other successively. Now let's look to the King James 1611. While King James was not at all an honorable man, history proves this, a great Bible came out of the this time period. You are correct in saying Yahweh's name is not used it dropped out and was changed to Jehovah in one of the earliest English Bibles. While it bothers me not to see the name Yahweh, I believe the translators saw the name so precious they were afraid to speak it. Back to Psalm 12:6-7 God spoke to us once in the Old Testament, second in the New Testament, and third in the King James 1611, then four more times in slight revisions up to the King James 1611 Bible used today otherwise known as the Authorized Version.
